

The University of New Haven has an opening for a one-year non-tenure track lecturer position in Forensic Psychology beginning fall semester 2013. The successful candidate will be a dynamic instructor, able to teach undergraduate courses within forensic psychology and also teach Drugs and Behavior, Personality Assessment and Abnormal Psychology. In addition to teaching, the role includes an assigned advising load of approximately 25 undergraduate psychology majors who are part of the Forensic Psychology concentration, opportunities to advise honors theses and opportunities to supervise graduate capstone projects. Because this is a full-time position service to the institution is expected. This will most likely include serving on a committee, helping to represent the Department of Psychology at one or two recruitment events and substantial participation in Psychology Department meetings and activities. A PhD or PsyD in Psychology is required as well a practical experience related to the field of Forensic Psychology.
