The University of New Haven invites applications for an adjunct professor to teach Marine & Coastal Law in the Fall 2021, with a potential to extend into future semesters. This course introduces the laws regulating natural resources management and conservation of coastal and marine ecosystems with a focus on U.S. legislation, and explores aspects of multi-use and conflicts between different sectors of the coastal economy as well as between public and private uses of the coastal zone. This course is required and provides essential background for graduate students in the Marine Policy & Management M.A. The teaching load will consist of one 3-hour lecture per week. The course will be offered in a remote synchronous format, thus, proximity to the University of New Haven campus is not required.

Qualifications:

- A J.D. is required, LLM, or PhD advantaged but not required.
- Knowledge and professional experience in environmental law with specialization in coastal and marine systems.
- The ideal candidate will have some teaching experience at the college level and a commitment to student-centered teaching is required. Preference will be given to those with a record of teaching excellence at the university level.
- Familiarity with online teaching is a plus.
