

Getting the Third Degree Worked for This Graduate



Tourism in Vietnam is booming, **Be' Nguyen** will tell you. It is not the Vietnam of the 1960s, when Nguyen was a young resident of Ho Chi Minh City trying to survive the conflict. Nor is it the Vietnam of the '70s and '80s, when residents were struggling to clear their lands of the ruins of war and stitch their lives back together.

It is now the Vietnam of

the Millennium, filled with opportunity.

One day, Nguyen, still of Ho Chi Minh City, asked her nephew to find on the Internet a college in the northeastern United States where she could earn a master's degree in Public Administration. She arrived at UNH in 2003, and the story might have ended there, with Nguyen's first master's degree. But she knew a need existed for trained civil servants in Vietnam.

"There are wonderful resources here," she says. "The people, the equipment, the facilities, I got so excited. So I took Tourism and Hospitality Management, and got another degree." In keeping with her academic doggedness, she then discovered that Sport Management was not being handled professionally in Vietnam. She was awarded her third master's degree, in Sport Management, from the University of New Haven during Winter Commencement 2008 in January.

Equipped with three master's degrees, she finally decided to go home.

"I believe I am one of the first students in Vietnam to bring professional sports management training home," she says. "I am so psyched."



In Memoriam



An adjunct faculty member of the English Department, Bohannah also worked as an academic skills counselor in the Office of Academic Services and tutored in writing in the Cen-



ter for Learning Resources. Bohannah's friend, Alice Guido, a former fellow adjunct in the English Department and a CLR writing tutor, wrote an article about Bohannah for the Charger Bulletin some years ago.

"The mementos scattered throughout her office and correspondence from students updating her on their post-UNH lives reveal that her ties extend well beyond graduation," Guido wrote. "A CLR veteran, Ms. Bohannah remembers more than 20 years ago when Room 106, now serving as the Computer Lab and the office of the CLR Coordinator, was used as a music classroom with strains of piano and recorded music wafting in over discussions of comma splices and mixed constructions.' Although the only tunes in the CLR today are those emitted by cell phones, Ms. Bohannah is still present, the soft-spoken lady seated at the round table near the picture window, her 16-ounce tea mug loaded and ready for an afternoon of tutoring sessions in composition and history."

Nathan D. Crowell, 22, a senior at the University of New Haven, died Oct. 25 after being fatally struck by a puck during a recreational league ice hockey game in Shelton.

Crowell, whose smile brightened any room he entered, was scheduled to receive his bachelor's degree at Winter Commencement. He had majored in investigative services,



minored in political science and had obtained a certificate in computer crime.

Dr. William Tafoya, a professor in UNH's National Security Program and a mentor to Crowell, remembered him as a quiet, attentive student who sat in the front row of Tafoya's Computer Crime class and who eventually earned the highest grade there. "Nathan had tremendous potential and was full of enthusiasm for the future," Tafoya told the audience at Winter Commencement, where Crowell's parents, David and Gale Crowell, accepted their son's degree posthumously. "He was inspired and looked forward to using his UNH education to serve his country. Can there be a more admirable goal for a 22-year-old, or a higher calling?"

Friends and family visited www.smithmason.com to share their memories of Crowell. One writer remembered him in this way: "He was a wonderful young man, everything you always wish for your child to become: intelligent, hard-working, kind, respectful, and full of fun. He had a way about him that made everyone at ease."


A Hero is Honored



MEMORIAM

It was mid-February in New Haven, but blazing red Christmas poinsettias still filled the house where **Dr. Caroline Dinegar** lived for many years with her closest friend, Dr. Elisabeth Van Dyke. "She loved to decorate, especially at Christmas," Van Dyke said. "She loved, too, to feed the birds and watch the cardinals."



Dinegar died Dec. 12 after a courageous battle with cancer. Her life mixed a softer side — a passion for penguins, a sense of humor that drove her to plop a tribal headpiece from Borneo atop a bust of Thomas Jefferson that she kept in her living room — with a hard-headedness that won her a legion of fans and critics. She was schooled at Cornell, Columbia and Oxford universities and studied Chinese on a Fulbright scholarship in Taiwan. She spent most of her life in higher education, leaving only when a challenging opportunity to adventure into a new realm lured her away. She taught at the University of Connecticut, Cal State Northridge, the University of Virginia and, finally, the University of New Haven, serving in-between as a foreign affairs officer and a liaison to the United States Mission to the United Nations in New York and Paris, a director of the Peace Corps in Malaysia, and a professor of strategy and politics at the U.S. Naval War College in Newport, R.I.. She even ran for mayor of New Haven, twice.

Her resume at the University of New Haven was equally diverse. She served as assistant provost, was chair of the Department of Political Science, chaired the Faculty Senate several times over the course of many years, served as acting director of the library, was interim dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, and directed the School of Hospitality and Tourism.

"I've had several careers," Dinegar told the New Haven Register in 1986. "Life has to be fun for me."

The Dr. Caroline A. Dinegar Memorial Scholarship has been established in her name to benefit a student majoring in Political Science at the University.
