

**Learn about** the lands, societies, and states stretching from Europe to Asia, drawing on the multidisciplinary experience and professional expertise of faculty from across the university.


**Requirements:** choose six courses (18 credit hours) in Economics, History, Humanities, National Security, and Political Science.


#### The Fall Schedule
